Guided city tour – Greifswald
The guided city tour through the university town and hanseatic city of Greifswald shows the history of Greifswald, one of the oldest towns in the Baltic Sea region. The Old Town of Greifswald with its medieval layout could be completely preserved. The cathedral St. Nicolai and the churches St. Marien and St. Jacobi, being visible from far and near, tower above the city. In the immediate vicinity of the Old Town you find the museal harbour with its maritime touch.

Convoy sailing trip
The convoy sailing trip starts in Wieck, Greifswald's small fishing village with its thatched cottages and the wooden bascule bridge, that is opened several times per day – by hand, today as it was in the past. The trip goes along the shore of Greifswald's "Bodden" (shallow bay) and the visitor gets an impression of the diversity of the landscape and the denizens of that region.

Tuesday, 7th September 2010

Full-day excursion - The offshore island of Ruegen
Germany's largest island is often described as the most beautiful with white sandy beaches, idyllic bays, peninsulas and lakes, tree-lined avenues, rugged cliffs, and lush beech forests. The world famous chalk cliffs can be found on Ruegen and especially on Jasmund in the self-named national park. At the Koenigsstuhl the mighty white cliffs reach up to 118 m out of the sea. Due to the washed out chalk the Baltic Sea in this area takes on a Caribbean turquoise in appearance and above the cliffs the green canopy of the ancient beech forest.

Stralsund Ozeaneum

The Ozeaneum visualizes a fascinating underwater journey through the northern seas. The visitor gains an impression of different marine habitats from the "Bodden" (shallow bay) as well as the open Atlantic. The biggest basin with a holding capacity of 2.6 million litres of water is the "Open Atlantic" tank in the North Sea round tour. The visitor can experience the diversity of the denizens and landscapes of the unique and very sensitive Baltic Sea region.

Trip on the sailing boat "Greif" (maximum 50 persons)

The two master "Greif" was build 1951 and is a 41 m long training sailing ship with 15 sails and a total sail area of 570 m². The trip goes along the shallow bay of Greifswald through the Baltic Sea. Visitors get an experience of nature and the diversity of that coast area with its denizens such as gulls and other seabirds. The trip includes lunch.

Visit of the Pomeranian State Museum

The guided tour through the museum shows 14,000 years of Pomeranian history. The visitors can research the Cretaceous period, listen to illustrious groups of people depicted on the "Croy Tapestry" with its 4 x 7 m of woven history. The exhibition has been designed to be informative and engrossing. Witnesses of the day, whether a famous duke or a young bride from the countryside, talk about their era from their perspective. A mediaeval craft can be tried out in the brick workshop, or the visitor can experience how the hanseatic traders did their accounts on an abacus.
